

Fingerprints

But Eamon grabbed his magnifying glass and held it above Thea's fingers. "See those ridges? They leave a mark on everything you touch. Police investigators use special powders to dust for fingerprints. The powder sticks to the invisible ridge marks. The investigator carefully brushes away the dust between the ridges and takes a picture of it." Eamon sat back. "The print can be lifted with a print-lifting tape, too."

"Eamon! We don't care about fingerprints right now. We just want to read the story."

"Well, I just thought you should know in case you get any ideas about going into my room and messing with my stuff," Eamon said. "I know how to lift prints with the detective kit I got for my birthday, so you'll be sorry if you do!"

"Don't be rude, Eamon," said Mom, who had come into the room. "I think you need to be more concerned about the kind of prints you're leaving on other people's lives.

"Prints on people's lives?" asked Eamon. "What does that mean?"

"I'm talking about the impressions we make on others," said Mom. "Like fingerprints, they identify us—not by ridges, but by how we make others feel. Our words and actions leave behind impressions that affect what others think about us—and about what we say we believe."

Activity! Lifting Prints

When others lift the prints we leave on their lives, we want them to look just like the fingerprints of Jesus." –Mom in today's story

In today's story, Eamon talked about how detectives lift fingerprints to solve crimes. In this activity, you'll learn about lifting prints yourself. This will get a little messy, so make sure you have an adult's permission and supervision.

Things you'll need:

- Some kind of powder (baby powder or cornstarch works well)
- Clear tape
- A soft, bushy brush (such as one used to apply makeup)
- Dark construction paper



What you'll need to do:

- Press your fingertips on a surface (such as a glass, a sink, or a counter).
- After you lift your finger, sprinkle some of your powder on the surface.
- 3. Carefully dust off the powder with your brush until you see a fingerprint shape.
- 4. Take a piece of clear tape and gently put it on top of the fingerprint.
- 5. Lift off the tape carefully and put it on the dark construction paper.
- 6. Now you have lifted a fingerprint!



Note: This project works better if your hands are a little oily. You can make them oilier by pressing them on your forehead or by applying lotion before you put down your prints.

Ask an Adult: What sort of things can Christians do to leave prints on other people's lives that look like those of Jesus?
Did you ever lift any Jesus prints from your life that someone left behind? What were they?

GOD MADE YOU AND LOVES YOU

God created everything there is—including you! He loves you more than any person could ever love you. He loves all people and created them to live in a perfect relationship with Him.

The Bible says:

SO GOD CREATED HUMAN BEINGS IN HIS OWN IMAGE. IN THE IMAGE OF GOD HE CREATED THEM; MALE AND FEMALE HE CREATED THEM. (GENESIS 1:27, NLT)

THE PROBLEM OF SIN

The first people God created—Adam and Eve—disobeyed Him. This caused sin to enter the world, breaking the perfect relationship they had with God. We sin by doing things God says are wrong and making ourselves the center of our lives instead of Him. Because Adam and Eve disobeyed, every person is born a sinner—no matter how good we try to be, we can't help but disobey and do wrong. Our sin separates us from God, and because He is perfect, He must punish sin—and the punishment for sin is death. Not just death of the body, but separation from God that lasts forever.

The Bible says:

EVERYONE HAS SINNED; WE ALL FALL SHORT OF GOD'S GLORIOUS STANDARD. (ROMANS 3:23, NLT)

IT IS YOUR SINS THAT SEPARATE YOU FROM YOUR GOD. HE TURNS AWAY FROM YOU WHEN HE SEES THEM. (ISAIAH 59:2, ERV)

GOD'S PERFECT PLAN

Because every person—including you—has sinned, every person deserves to be punished by death. But God loves us so much He sent His Son, Jesus Christ, to take the punishment for our sin. He lived a perfect life on earth and then died on a cross in our place, even though He didn't deserve it. But it didn't end there—God raised Him back to life! Through Jesus' death and resurrection, the punishment for sin was paid so we could be forgiven and have a relationship with God.

The Bible says:

GOD LOVED THE WORLD SO MUCH THAT HE GAVE HIS ONLY SON, SO THAT EVERYONE WHO BELIEVES IN HIM WOULD NOT BE LOST BUT HAVE ETERNAL LIFE. (JOHN 3:16, ERV)

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN FOR YOU?

It means you don't have to pay the price of death for your sin—Jesus paid it for you! When you trust in Jesus by believing He died and rose from the dead to save you from sin and choose to make Him the center of your life instead of yourself, your sin is forgiven and you receive a new life as God's child that lasts forever.

Key Questions to Understanding God's Good News

Smart Like a Fox

CREATURE FEATURE: ARCTIC FOX



Arctic foxes may look cute, but they are clever, tough little creatures.

They live in the Arctic, a land of towering icebergs and brutal sub-zero

winds. Their beautiful white fur camouflages them and protects them from the cold. To keep warm, Arctic foxes lie down and curl their fluffy tails over their faces like scarves. They even have fur growing on their feet that keeps their paws from freezing to the ice. They have their own fur boots!

Arctic foxes hunt alone, but they know that survival depends on sticking together

The only relief an Arctic fox gets from the cold is in summer, which lasts between fifty and sixty days. They shed their white fur coats in favor of a cooler gray undercoat. As the snow melts, their summer look helps them blend in with newly exposed rocks and plants. Arctic foxes hunt and store food underground in summer to dig up in winter. Researchers found one fox had hidden forty birds and more than thirty eggs in one spot!

Arctic foxes hunt alone, but they know that survival depends on sticking together. They mate for life and live in small groups in a den. Dens can be passed down and used by the same family for over a hundred years. Often one grown pup, usually female, will stay behind when her brothers and sisters move out to help her parents raise the next litter of pups. Now that's one dedicated big sister!

Did you know that you can be like an Arctic fox? In good seasons and tough seasons, God provides all you need to thrive. Dig deep into His Word every day and hide Scripture in your heart so you'll remember it when you face adversity. And don't go it alone—talk to God in prayer, and ask others to pray for you too. Along the way, be a big brother or sister to a younger believer and share what you've learned with them.
